COEDS AT LEHIGH

During the four years of coeducation at Lehigh women have suffered through endless generalizations about their personal lives, lived with only one ladies' room in a five-story building, and tried to be inconspicuous in a class with one other woman. They have also managed to join the Marching Band, head the Forum and SAC, edit publications, become members of the service organization Alpha Phi Omega, and the social fraternity for commuting students, Alpha Lambda Omega, form a Caucus and invite men to join, and form their own athletic teams.

The list is long, but the fact remains that women have definitely made their mark on Lehigh. Integration with a formerly all-male institution is never easy, but considering the uneven proportion of men to women, the women have been able to become active leaders in all facets of campus life. The controversy with the band was one of the most widely-publicized events during the women's brief history at Lehigh. The issue peaked in the fall of '73 when seven women were given the right to march with the men. Formerly they were only permitted to play from the stands. One female band member commented that the women have proved that they can "play and march as well and be just as gross as the guys."

Social life was possibly the largest barrier to overcome for Lehigh women, and it hasn't really been overcome yet. The ratio of men to women in the fall of 1971 was 31-1 and many men still imported their dates. Others, in their amazement over seeing women on campus, treated them as an oddity. Why? "It's gotten a lot better here since we were freshmen", said senior Tom Whitten, "but it's still bad. It won't be good here until the ratio is even, which we're not going to get (The administration planned on levelling off at 800) There's very few women in my classes and there's no neutral ground. Girls feel like they're getting picked up if they visit a fraternity." To Whitten, a typical Lehigh coed is "heavy, mediocre and uppity". To combat this, another senior Mike Pennino suggested, quite seriously, that women should be made to "wear dresses and go braless" to improve the looks of the campus — which is an indication of how far Lehigh is from a completely healthy coeducation situation.

Nothing compared to the social situation in the fall of 1971. But the comments and observations of freshman, sophomore and junior women do not reflect an overall satisfaction with subsequent falls. Many say, "It's just not natural yet." Many women at Lehigh find themselves in a coeducational environment that is not true to its word. Its academic emphasis is lopsided in favor of men — a situation that needs remedy which may or may not be forthcoming. Inevitably, some negative attitudes about women were formed initially and still persist. Hopefully, with the addition of more women, these attitudes will decline as women continue to make a difference to Lehigh in the future. With input from student leaders, the help of administrators and the original impetus given by Ruth Hurley Vihon, former assistant dean of students, Lehigh coeducation got a good start — now we need more women to keep a good start going.

LIVING AT LEHIGH

Coeducation has forever changed the face of the Lehigh campus — more superficially, but even more visible are the different ways of living to which Lehigh students have access. Fraternities and freshman dorms have the distinction of being the oldest living options on campus. As at most all-male or formerly all-male institutions, the fraternity system at Lehigh is well-regulated, formally-structured and diversified enough to accommodate the desires and personalities of almost every Lehigh male student. Some say that the predominance of fraternities creates an imbalance; a divisive influence among the student body. This criticism has declined in the last few years as living options have increased. Lehigh now offers more residence options than many universities of comparable size.





SMAGS (Saucon Married and Graduate Students) still has fewer married and graduate students than LU undergrads — and there is a diversity of opinion about that living option.

"If you have a car, it's great, otherwise, forget it." "I love having the fields right behind us. We can run around, barbecue, ride bikes. In the spring, it seems very far removed from school."


SMAGS

There are complaints on the construction, and appreciation of privacy. In addition, many SMAGS residents appreciate living close to Hellertown and the feel of a small town.

RH-11 ON-CAMPUS APTS.

If a student wants to stay on campus, but doesn't like the dorms, there is an alternative. RH-11 has finally appeared. Were they worth the wait? "Oh, yeah. It isn't just a dorm with 4 people in it instead of 40. You can entertain whenever you want and still have privacy." Some cite proximity to the snack bar as a major incentive, but naturally, there are drawbacks; quickly-deteriorating decor, for one. "They're not put together real well. Within the apartment, you can hear every word in every room." One of the major complaints has been the "defacement" behind the University Center. One student said, "I wouldn't say it wrecks the look of the campus, but I'd say it definitely doesn't fit in." Suggested improvements: "Closets! (there are none in RH-11), and more windows."





DORMITORIES

Most Lehigh students live in the dormitories; the infamous freshmen quad, centennials, M&M or Taylor. The freshmen quad is perhaps most easily characterized: rowdy, noisy, crude and proud of it. The addition of women to Richards two years ago seems not to have changed that spirit drastically. It is here that 80% of Lehigh's students are introduced to Lehigh — what an introduction. After that experience, the choice is: fraternity, off-campus, or another dormitory. Many choose centennials — newer, prettier, quieter.

M&M is in the center of campus and was the first dorm to be coed by sections, very successfully. Taylor-dwellers are fiercely protective of their house, looked down upon by most other residents, but they are probably one of the most cohesive living groups on campus.





OFF-CAMPUS

Off-campus living can encompass the South Side, across the bridge, or even, as pictured here, a 52-acre farm in upper Bucks County. Seniors Rodd Anderson, Bill Barry, Mike Ronan and Lou Terlizzi chose to live "off-off-campus" — 14 miles away. The obvious question is: "Do you really go to school?" Bill answered, "If you know you've got to finish school, you discipline yourself to getting up and over to school." Bill admitted to being skeptical of the arrangement at first but Mike was "gung-ho all the way." "There were times when Lehigh was the last thought on my mind, though." Lou added, "The house motto was 'drink 'til you stink', but it was a unique experience that we'll never be able to do again."





ACTIVITIES

Lehigh, as it has for many years, again presented this year a stunning collection of eminent lecturers, open to the public and free of charge. Blaustein Lecturer Dean Rusk appeared for three days: April 1, 2, 3; one of which saw the fall of Saigon, making his lectures particularly significant.

The grapplers won the EIWA crown for the first time since 1967, with a record seven champions. Mark Lieberman, a freshman, was the first Lehigh recipient of the Billy Sheridan award, symbolic of the wrestler with the most pins in the least amount of time.

Mike Frick won his second championship, this time at 134. In beating Pitt's Rande Stottlemeyer, 16-8, Frick won his second "most outstanding" trophy.

The two big surprises for the Engineers were Marty Lynn and Don McCorkel. Lynn, wrestling at 126, beat Navy's first-seeded Mike Beck in the semi-finals before bowing to George Bryant in the finals.

McCorkel in his first championship scored the upset of the tournament by beating Navy's other first seed, Jeff Simons, in the finals.

Navy transfer Lance Leonhardt won the 118 pound championship by downing former teammate Mark Costello in the finals, 11-9, avenging an earlier loss in the dual meet.

The toughest weight class at Annapolis was 142, and this spot was ably manned by Pat Sculley. Sculley, whose only loss during the regular season came at the hands of Iowa's Joe Amore, soundly beat former NCAA champ Dan Muthler in the semis before beating Yale's Jim Bennet in the finals. Bennet went on to win this year's NCAA championship at Princeton.

150 was a troublesome weight for the Engineers this year. A total of four matches were won during the season. Armin Vaihinger had two of victories and wrestled in the Easterns. A natural 142 pounder, he lost two tough matches.

A new record for most victories in a year was set by Mike Lieberman. His 18 victories passed the record set last year by Tom Sculley, Terry DeStito, and Frick (17). He won the 177 pound crown by beating Rutgers' Steve Bonsall in the finals.

DeStito, the only champ that Lehigh will lose by graduation, almost didn't make it to the finals as he injured his shoulder in his first match. He recovered to score two quick pins and win his second championship in as many years by mauling Navy's Mark Stepanovich in the finals.

The 16 victories by the Engineers was also a school record. Their losses came to Iowa and Cal Poly while they had ties against Iowa State and Penn State.

Their 54 points was a school record. They had two national champs in Mike Frick and Mike Lieberman. Terry DeStito took a fifth place at heavyweight.

Frick, a fourth seed, beat first-seeded Mark Belknap, 11-7, in the semis before crushing Oklahoma's Brian Beatson in the finals. His performance earned him yet another "most outstanding" trophy, the first Lehigh winner of the award since 1955.

Lieberman, a third seed, wrecked Slippery Rock's Bill Shuffstall in the semis. He faced Iowa's Chris Campbell in the finals. Campbell, who had beaten Lieberman in the dual meet, was winning 4-3 late in the last period when Lieberman converted on a power trip for a takedown and held on to win by a point.

In only its third year of varsity standing, the team has met with nothing but success. Needless to say, posting a 10-4-2 record for the '74-75 season pleased first year coach Joe Biedron (Elmira '73).

Biedron had a strong nucleus of sophomores and juniors to go along with only two seniors: alternate captain Doug Hansen and Ken Ludlum. Six freshmen rounded out the Engineer sextet. The new coach also bolstered the hockey team's schedule in '74-'75. They tackled the University of Pennsylvania J.V.'s (Division I); University of New Haven and Elmira College (both Division II); and Amherst College, a Division III rival.

The '74-'75 season had several highlights, including establishing two new University records. Sophomore Bob Oliva eclipsed the individual scoring mark, shattering the old standard of 33 points, with his 25 goals-25 assists for 50 points on the season. The team gained another scoring honor. The '74-'75 team scored 114 goals, surpassing the previous mark of 97.

Good scoring and open play characterized the Engineer hockey team. The Brown and White trounced the opposition with scores such as 11-3, 10-1, 11-5, 10-5 and the most lopsided game of the year, versus arch rival Lafayette, 18-3. The old adage, "the best defense is a good offense," seemed to be the team's motto. Alternate captain, Mike Dale, a rushing defenseman, strengthened the Team's offensive punch by being the number two scorer on the squad (16 goals-21 assists-37 pts.)

This fast pace provided Lehigh followers with exciting hockey all season long. In the game against the North Penn Eagles, the fans had all the action they could handle. A three-goal hat trick was scored by Dale, the score board showed a 7-1 victory and there was a third period brawl in the penalty box involving the entire North Penn bench and the six Engineers on the ice, plus Lehigh's team manager Jim Marino.

Villanova came to the Al-Beth Ice Palace on February 25 to do battle with the Engineers for the MAC crown. Emotions and elbows were high in this important confrontation. A previous 5-5 tie at Villanova set the stage for this meeting. After a scoreless first period, the Wildcats took a quick 2-0 lead in the middle stanza. That stood until Oliva tallied a power play goal with a minute left in the period to start the Engineer comeback.

It all boiled down to a 20-minute game and league supremacy. The boards resounded with body checks and the tempo of the game rose with the fans' cheers. Freshman Marv Langley tied the game up and captain Marc Rinaldi scored the game winner on breakaway that caught the goalie flat-footed. Alex Lamar, another frosh, put the icing on the MAC cake with a goal. At the buzzer the Brown and White swarmed goalie Pete Bechtel in a triumphant celebration.

All the hustle, hard work, and desire on the part of the players, Biedron, and assistant coach Bruce Schennum, paid off in that game. Much of the same style, flair and success of the 74-75 hockey team and more is expected to thrill Engineer hockey fans in the 75-76 season.

GROUND OFFICIALLY BROKEN FOR FAIRCHILD LABORATORY



Official groundbreaking ceremonies were held in April for the \$1.8-million Sherman Fairchild Laboratory for Solid State Studies at Lehigh University. (An architectural rendering of the laboratory is above.)

Dr. Joseph F. Libsch said: "The new facility, which is scheduled for completion in August of 1976, will provide for a concentration of people and equipment which should help Lehigh to contribute to, and remain at the cutting edge, of solid state developments in the future."

The laboratory is being made possible at Lehigh by a \$5.25-million grant from The Fairchild Foundation. The major gift includes, in addition to the building, two endowed professorships, eight graduate fellowships, ten undergraduate scholarships, and a major lecture series.

Others taking part in the groundbreaking included Dr. Deming Lewis, Lehigh President; Edward G. Uhl, President of Fairchild Industries, Inc.; and University Trustees Edward A. Curtis and Frank C. Rabold, Chairman and Vice Chairman, respectively, of the Board's Physical Planning and Plant Committee.


